

The Trustees of the Wood Industry Development and Education Trust (WIDE Trust) reserve the right to review, and/or amend these terms and conditions from time to time without prior notification

- Applications must be received by the Fund Manager prior to commencement of the course of study to which the application refers. Retrospective applications are not considered by the Trustees.
- All applications for a course of study should cover a maximum study period of 12-months. New applications are required to be submitted year-on-year for studies that continue over multiple academic years.
- Applicants who receive funding from the WIDE Trust and do not complete their course of study within the study period noted on their Funding Approval documentation will, in most cases, be required to refund any grants paid by the WIDE Trust.
- Recipients of grants from the WIDE Trust are required to provide the Fund Manager with Certificates of Completion/Attendance, results for papers studied, written feedback on educational short courses and programmes and such other documentation to verify that studies supported by the WIDE Trust have been completed.
- Applicants must begin drawing funding approved by the WIDE Trust no later than one month following the receipt of the WIDE Trust Funding Approval or the start date of their studies whichever is the later. Failure to do so will result in the expiry of WIDE Trust funding.
- Under current tax legislation in New Zealand there are no tax implications for grants made to New Zealand-based recipients of grants from the WIDE Trust.
- Recipients of grants from the WIDE Trust are obligated to ensure they fulfil the terms and conditions of the grant awarded to them as detailed in the WIDE Trust Funding Approval documentation.
- All funding decisions are at the absolute discretion of the WIDE Trust and are not subject to any rights of review or appeal.
